SHORE UP! Inc. is a private, non-profit Community Action Partnership located in Salisbury, Maryland. Formed in 1965, SHORE UP! has been serving low-income individuals and families on Maryland's lower Eastern shore for over 50 years. Assisting approximately 15,000 annually, the agency's acronym is fitting, meaning Self-Help on Rural Economics and Urban Problems.

The main focus of SHORE UP! is to assist individuals in reaching economic security by providing a number of programs and services. Specifically, the agency's mission is to revitalize communities and empower individuals and families to maintain long-term independence and achieve economic security. Additionally, SHORE UP! envisions a community where individuals and families have opportunities and resources to live with dignity, achieve their fullest potential, maintain long-term independence and become economically secure.

SHORE UP! is led by a Board of Directors who guide agency policy, as well as Executive Director Freddy L. Mitchell who is responsible for the organization's day-to-day operations.

In addition to developmental and school readiness skills which ultimately prepare our youth to thrive in a global society, SHORE UP! examines the family life, administering programs which help individuals provide the best parental guidance to their children as possible and gain economic security.


During the 2018-2019 program year, the Creative Curriculum in the Head Start and Early Head Start programs continued to work well in preparing students for Kindergarten. In fact, over 90 percent of Early Head Start and Head Start children were meeting age expectations for the Social and Emotional Development domains, one of the five domains essential in school readiness.

This year, Head Start also continued to partner with families to find effective methods in dealing with issues such as single parenting, illiteracy, homelessness, substance abuse, child abuse and neglect, health and nutrition, domestic violence, budget and finances and community violence.

Parents were also excited about Active Parenting: First Five Years, SHORE UP!'s research based parenting curriculum. A video-based, interactive learning experience, Active Parenting provides parents and other care providers of enrolled children a model for parenting children ages three to five. The program includes interactive lessons for parents, including but not limited to, parenting in a democratic society; the stages of child development during the first five years and their implications to health, safety and effective parenting; the parenting skills necessary for encouraging positive behavior and development, including skills for nonviolent discipline, communication, problem solving, family enrichment and encouragement; and the methods to increase mindfulness and self-calming in parents and children.

Since 1965, SHORE UP!'s Head Start and Early Head Start programs have met the needs of children and their families along Maryland's Eastern Shore. This year was no different. We were happy to welcome the 761 children and their families enrolled in Head Start, along with the 172 pupils and their families in the Early Head Start program.

We will continue to provide the services needed in our seven-county area to ensure successful, healthy, safe, happy and economically secure families.

SHORE UP! Inc.'s Head Start and Early Head Start programs serve children in seven counties on the Eastern Shore, including Worcester, Somerset, Wicomico, Dorchester, Talbot, Queen Anne's and Kent counties. The agency operates 13 Head Start and Early Head Start centers and served as a delegate grantee for the Maryland Family Network for Early Head Start.

The mission of the Head Start and Early Head Start program is to provide comprehensive, integrated, full-year services that promote school readiness for children from birth to five years of age. Early Head Start focuses on children from birth to age three. Head Start attendees are ages three to five.

To fulfill the program's mission, staff must develop the following areas to ensure school readiness, including: social and emotional development, language and literacy, cognitive and general knowledge, approaches toward learning and physical well-being along with motor skills. In addition to preparing children for school, SHORE UP!'s Head Start and Early Head Start programs also assist families in supporting their child's learning process.

As a part of the agency's Head Start Performance Standards, parents, staff and a Policy Council work together to achieve the program's mission. The Policy Council is comprised of community representatives and parents representing each center, who meet once per month as a part of the Governing Body to offer guidance and provide feedback regarding pertinent program decisions. SCHOOL READINESS: PREPARATION FOR KINDERGARTEN

Learning in Head Start and Early Head Start is based upon developmental stages and organized by domains. Domains are broad areas of learning for children from birth to age five. Children learn and are assessed at SHORE UP! Inc. in the domain areas of: approaches to learning; social and emotional development; language and literacy; cognition; and perceptual, motor and physical development.

SHORE UP! Inc.'s efforts in preparing children for Kindergarten are research based. Please note the following regarding the agency's curriculum and methods of preparation.

The Creative Curriculum for Preschool is utilized in Head Start. This curriculum uses exploration and discovery as a way to develop the child's level of confidence, critical thinking skills and creativity.

The Creative Curriculum for Infants, Toddlers and Twos is in the Early Head Start program. The tool enables children to develop their interests and strengths through daily routines and experiences.

Head Start attendees are also taught to use projects and play time as a way of learning. Projects and play are incorporated throughout the day through activities such as group discussions, reading, centers and small group work. The curriculum aligns to Common Core and the OHS (Office of Head Start) Framework. According to corestandards.org, the Common Core is "a set of high-quality academic standards in Mathematics and English Language Arts/Literacy. These learning goals outline what a student should know and be able to do at the end of each grade."

Professional Development days for staff include reviewing the curriculum, School Readiness domains (noted above), best practices and engaging in joint professional development training opportunities with the staff and trainers in the public school system.

Children are assessed in the fall, winter, spring and summer (Early Head Start only), to determine whether children are below, meeting or exceeding development in the domain areas. Assessments consist of the following:


CLASS-This Classroom Assessment Scoring System measures the interactions between students and classroom staff. TPITOS-Teaching Pyramid Infant Toddler Observation Scale, which measures the classroom climate. ITERS-Infant Toddler Environment Rating Scale which measures both interactions and environmental conditions, such as the number of materials, access to materials, lighting, handwashing and toileting practices, safety and more. A Classroom Observation Checklist has been created from accreditation standards.

School readiness data from 2018-2019 indicated that 91 percent of Early Head Start and 91 percent of Head Start children were meeting age expectations for the Social and Emotional Development Domain.



ATTENDANCE

The chart below indicates the daily average attendance for SHORE UP!'s Head Start and Early Head Start programs. The average attendance for Head Start was 85 percent. Early Head Start's attendance was 88 percent.





PARENTAL ENGAGEMENT

Staff in SHORE UP!'s Head Start and Early Head Start program work with parents to ensure they are fully engaged in their child's education. They also strive to prepare the parents for security. The following are ways in which SHORE UP! engages parents, as well as the parental engagement activities that took place in Fiscal Year 2019.

Types of Parental Engagement

EARLY Head Start/ Head Start parents may volunteer to receive a number of different services as a part of SHORE UP!'s Whole Family Initiative. This initiative enables SHORE UP! Inc. to assist families in combating intergenerational poverty.

For example, parents may receive GED program coaching at all centers. Families who are interested in furthering their education obtain assistance from Family Service Workers to enroll and receive courses needed for GED preparation. Family service workers also enroll individuals interested in obtaining CDL (Commercial Driver's License), CNA (Certified Nursing Assistant) and CDA (Child Development Associate) certifications, as well as training in Phlebotomy. The Whole Family Initiative also includes an Active Parenting Curriculum, transportation assistance and more.

An Active Parenting Curriculum is offered to support the growth and development of children by providing families and caregivers the skills necessary to prepare their children at home.

Income eligible families are encouraged to apply for the Energy Assistance program.

The Volunteer Income Tax Assistance program ensures that all families have the opportunity to utilize free tax services.

Family Service Workers assist families with transportation to medical appointments if families demonstrate that transportation is a barrier.

Parents volunteer at the center-answering the telephone, making copies, as well as assisting in the classroom and during field trips.

Parents volunteer during the interviewing process, strengthening their communication and writing skills.

PARENTAL ENGAGEMENT ACTIVITIES





The agency reported 32 volunteers for the Head Start and Early Head Start centers. Three of those volunteers were current or former parents of Head Start students.

There were a number of parental engagement activities, such as "A Night In Hollywood" hosted by the Princess Anne Head Start Center. A father engagement program, the event included over 30 fathers who walked with their children down the red carpet of excellence. Fathers and their children also participated in a variety of fun activities.

Exercise and healthy eating was the focus during "Frisbee with Fathers."


Children and fathers participated in "March Dadness." The participants learned relay activities using math and cognitive skills.


Stockton parents, teachers, family service workers and the site coordinator built a float for the Pocomoke City Christmas










HEALTH INFORMATION

Dorchester Early Learning Center has made significant strides since 1988. Established by SHORE UP! Inc., the early learning facility began their program as a family support center.

"We started by providing free, comprehensive services to families, targeting parents and their children from birth through age three, as well as pregnant women," says Shashanna Reed, director for the Dorchester Early Learning Center.

The only drawback to the program included the hours of operation; the facility could only offer services to students two days per week. The Cambridge, Md. center was recently awarded a Duration Grant, which allows the facility to offer vital programs five days a week.

"This is a great opportunity for the children and for families," says Reed. "We need as much time with these children as possible, because Head Start and Early Head Start programs support children's growth and development in a positive learning environment."

According to the US Dept. of Health and Human Services website, the purpose of the Duration Grant is to "increase the total number of hours for high quality educational services offered to children enrolled in Head Start and Early Head Start center-based and family child care programs."

In addition to adding three days per week for instruction, the center has been updated and is currently undergoing needed renovations, such as four new classroom spaces, a new Heating, Ventilation and Air Conditioning System, new staff, adult bathrooms and a beautiful state-of-the-art playground. All renovations should be complete late January 2020.

"Even though the journey has been long and tough, it will pay off in the long run for the families in this community," states Reed.


